### MAPLE VALLEY STREET RATS CAR CLUB

Our club was founded in Maple Valley, Washington. The club has two primary goals. The first goal is to promote preservation, enjoyment, restoration and or modification of 1982 and older vehicles without make or model preference. The second goal is to provide scholarships on automotive technology to deserving students.

The Maple Valley Street Rats is a spin-off from the Tahoma High School Street Rats, also of Maple Valley. The Tahoma High School auto shop instructor and his students established the Tahoma High School Street Rats in 1985. The name "Street Rats came from Street Rods plus the big block Chevrolet engine nickname. A student from Tahoma High School used the colors scarlet and the black to design the Street Rat logo. The original goal of the high school club was to develop interest in hot rods and muscle cars. As the club grew, its goal shifted to providing community services such as food drives, Easter egg hunts, Christmas toy drives and many more services.

The idea for the Maple Valley Street Rats started in an effort to offer financial scholarships to deserving students going to automotive schools after high school. From 1999 to 2021 the Maple Valley Street Rats has awarded more than \$72,000 for students to attend a variety of automotive schools. The club started in 1998 with seven members, mostly from local automotive businesses in Maple Valley. The Maple Valley Street Rats has developed the following scholarship fundraisers:

Friday night cruise-ins Covington, Washington at the Walmart store. Cruise-ins start the 1st Friday in May and commence the last Friday in September. The club has a trailer that is towed to each event. The trailer has an announcer that plays 60's and 70's music. There are drawings throughout the show and potential winners are awarded automotive type gifts.

Kent Lions Club, working in association with the City of Kent has produced The Cornucopia Days event in Kent for 49 years. The event has not only provided good family entertainment for the more than 150,000 attendees each year, but also has provided funding by which Kent Lions have been able to generously contribute to community projects and charities.

### THIS YEAR'S OLD TIMERS ARE: HUSBAND AND WIFE, SHARON BERSAAS AND MICHAEL JOHNSON



Sharon Bersaas married Michael Johnson in 1997 and kept her Norwegian father's name. She is first generation American on her father's side. She became President of Mill Creek Neighborhood around 2010 and founded, in partnership with Nancy Simpson, the Experience Historical Kent. She created with Ngocdzung Smith The Mill Creek Neighborhood book and also with husband Michael Johnson wrote a grant from the City of Kent for a Plaque Project for 100 homes. Together with her husband, she successfully applied for grants for the museum, for Historic District designation status for Mill Creek Historic District from the Kent Landmarks Commission, and for placement of the Dvorak Baron on the Most Endangered Historic Properties List for The Washington Trust for Historic Preservation.

Michael has served as the Treasurer of the Mill Creek Neighborhood Council since 2008, and since 2019 the Treasurer of the Greater Kent Historical Society. In 2009 he successfully lobbied the City of Kent to create a transition zone between the Mill Creek Neighborhood and downtown Kent so as to not allow high rise buildings up against the neighborhood. With spouse Sharon, he applied for grants, researched the home history in Mill Creek, and put over 100 plaques on the homes in Mill Creek. In 2014, he and Sharon successfully applied and received Historic District status from the Kent Landmarks Commission for a portion of the Mill Creek Neighborhood.



GON BOAT RACES ON LAKE MERIDIAN

Saturday, July 9, thirty plus teams will come to Kent to race for medals. The races begin at 8:30 a.m. and finals are after 3 p.m. Teams are from western Canada, Washington & Oregon, along with individual paddlers from California and across the nation! We also have multiple community teams trained by local dragon boat clubs attending. They will race 250 meters while the club teams will race 500 meters. There will be numerous local Kent teams racing for the honors. The Kent Lions and the Kent Dragon Boat Association have spent all year planning for this event; it is one of the largest races in the state of Washington. The beautiful venue of Lake Meridian provides the perfect location for this style of race while giving the team members and public an outstanding view. This race benefits the Northwest Lions Foundation for Sight and Hearing.


### SHORT BACKGROUND ON DRAGON BOAT RACING

Dragon boat racing is people friendly and teams contain people of varying degrees of athletic ability and physical limitations. Some teams are recreational, in condition, and others may be seriously athletic. Some others may be blind, survivors of disease such as cancer, have diabetes, and have other special needs. They learn about what they can achieve and do not allow themselves to be overwhelmed with any restrictions. They celebrate life by being actively engaged with it, and having a great time living it.

The time spent in a dragon boat results in teams learning to work together in unison to race to the finish line. The skills that are acquired have more to do with technique and synchronization.

than brawn. Upper body strength is achieved in the gym and increased in the dragon boat. Dragon boats can go at a fast clip, rising upon the water, as paddlers do up to 90 strokes and more a minute, an amount for a well seasoned experienced team. In China a dragon boat team looks like an extremely fast perpetual motion machine. The lighter the weight, the more seasoned the paddlers, the faster they can go.




### To Lake Meridian: After driving under Highway

### KENT LIONS LEGAL STATEMENT



- 3. The Kent Lions Foundation was formed and incorporated in the State of Washington, since 1996.
- 4. The Kent Lions Club has a State Master Business License and UBI number.
- 5. The Kent Lions Club is a 501 c(4), the Foundation is a 501 c(3) for federal tax and filing purposes.
- 6. The Kent Lions Club files for and maintains all proper City of Kent permits.
- 7. The Kent Lions Club is the governing and prime sponsor of the Kent Cornucopia Days and all of its affiliations. The Kent Cornucopia Days is a committee of the Kent Lions Club and is governed by the Kent Lions Club Board of Directors. The Kent Cornucopia Days is treated as a project of the Kent Lions Club, a purpose of the Kent Lions Club, and one of the many events or activities for which the Kent Lions Club exists as a non-profit organization. # DIRECTIONS

From the North:

From the Seattle area, take Interstate 5 south to the Kent Des Moines exit (also known as state route # 516). Drive east on this road, drive under Highway 167, then turn left (north) on 4th Ave, just a couple of blocks and you are there

### From the Eastside:


Take Interstate 405 south to Highway 167, take Exit 2 (you will see Kent, Auburn signs). Drive south on 167, exit at the Willis Street / Des Moines exit (also know as state route # 516). Turn left (east) on this road, drive under Highway 167, then turn left (north) on 4th Ave, just a couple of blocks and you are there.

### From the South:

From the Tacoma area, take Interstate 5 north to the Kent Des Moines exit (also known as state route # 516). Drive east on this road. drive under Highway 167, then turn left (north) on 4th Ave. just a couple of blocks and you are there. Or take Interstate 5 north to the Highway 18 exit, go east on 18. turn north on Highway 167 (Kent, Renton exit), drive north on 167, exit at the Willis Street / Des Moines exit (also know as state route # 516). Turn right (east) on this road, drive under Highway 167, then turn left (north) on 4th Ave, just a couple of blocks and you are there.

### Parade participant:

Follow the directions above, make sure you exit at the Willis Street / Des Moines (also know as state route # 516). Go east Willis until 4th Avenue, turn left (north) on 4th. Follow Police and SEAFAIR Marshal directions



### To Lake Meridian

Follow the above directions, but after driving under Highway 167, continue on State Route 516, turn left on Central, then right on Smith Street, continue on Route 516 following Kent-Kangley Road, pass 132nd, and continue east for about 1 mile. You will see the lake on the left.

### PARKING

1. Kent Transit Center & Sounder Parking Lot & Garage

West Smith St & Railroad Ave.

The following routes take you to the Transit Center: Buses are 150, 153, 158, 159, 162, 164, 166, 168, 169, 180, 183, 566, 913, 914, 916, 918. Sounder Trains are 1500 - 1516

2. Centennial Garage Titus & 2nd Right next to Kent Cornucopia Days, sanctioned fund-raiser for PICC.

- 3. Municipal Titus & 1st Right next to Kent Cornucopia Days
- 4. Kent Meridian High School Canyon Rd & 101 Ave SE Take the Metro or Kent "Shuttle" bus from this point to event, park in school parking lot and walk just outside of school fence for pick-up at Metro sign. The following will take you to & from Kent Meridian High School to Kent Cornucopia Days: 159, 169, 914 & 916.
- 5. The old Kent Park & Ride James & Lincoln & Smith St The following will take you to & from the Park & Ride to Kent Cornucopia Days: 150, 158, 159, 162, 166, 180, 913 & 918.
- 6. Any legal Public side street. Park in any open public side

street parking spot, please observe all signs and street barricades. Please observe private property, no parking rights, you will be towed. Kent Cornucopia sanctions no private parking sales.
